This is the Advent Letter I sent out to folkx this year. Because it mentions the people of Chatfield UMC I thought you might like to read it.

Advent 2019

I have been a United Methodist minister for over 25 years. There have been some constancies in these years, preaching, teaching, confirmation classes, service trips, record keeping...Enough to develop a rhythm that defines most days. Yet, one of the joys of ministry is that each day will bring a new challenge or joy and each place of ministry will bring personalities and uniqueness that opens doors to growth and possibilities. Here is a little recap of the year that I traveled with my husband of eight plus years. I love how Steve and I have woven together our lives into a rich story of loving, serving and being together.

I took my grandchildren on a week-long trip to a cabin near the north shore in Minnesota. The cabin came equipped with wide bottom kayaks. At first I was hesitate to allow them to venture into the lake in those kayaks. But this was one of those quintessential northern lakes, blue as blue, clear as clear, and shallow for quite a ways out from shore. The wide bottoms meant it would take some doing to tip those kayaks. Lillian the oldest at 11, watched a YouTube video to teach herself how to handle the kayak. She and I took a long trip into the lake. Matthew a nine year old who is Julianne's boyfriend's Michael's son, listened to the adults as they instructed him from the dock. After a few false starts, he was paddling short distances from the dock. Owen, also 9, and a bit independent and dominate on his left, listened, did what we told him and ended up beaching the kayak. Finally, he had enough and just did it himself. And became quite adventurous.

Isn't it just amazing to watch young children learn new skills and learn to enjoy life in a whole different way? I want to never, ever lose that wonder and delight in life. I never, ever want to lose sight of the possibilities even after 25 years of doing something.

In January I participated in a study cruise which took me to the island of Roatan near Honduras. Snorkeling is one of the joys in life. I don't really like swimming, but a flotation device, snorkel gear and warm salt water changes the whole dynamic. To see, with my own eyes, the wonder of life under the sea is brilliant. This snorkeling adventure was led by a woman who, not only provides some of the best snorkeling experiences, but also gives her clients the opportunity to visit a little village 'off the beaten path'. Here she encourages the children to keep their village clean by offering them rewards for bags of trash which she collects and removes from the village. She also encourages them to pursue their dreams by offering them jobs as nature interpreters and dive companions. Besides meeting the village children, we also ate lunch at the home of a widow and her daughters. Traditional, simple island food and the best key lime pie was shared around her porch table. I was so inspired by the guide's ethic and desire to bring economic strength to this little village. It is these types of stories and adventures that give me hope.

Here at home, in Chatfield, I am seeing men and women of my own 'village' working hard to start businesses, mentor students, run theater programs and engage in care of neighbor. Six years ago when we started the

feeding ministries out of Chatfield UMC we didn't realize how much need there was in our community and how much support we would receive from the community! From elementary students to scouts to local businesses, we are never in need of the resources it takes to keep a food shelf, a weekend back pack program, a school snack program and a summer lunch program abundantly stocked. We never have to turn away anyone. It is such an amazing thing. Steve does an exceptional job of keeping the food shelf running smoothly and volunteers motivated to continue working. Seeing people coming together to serve neighbor is exactly what Jesus envisioned the kingdom of heaven would be like. It is humbling to be a part of that work.

This fall, with Bev Simpson, I began a new ministry to introduce adults in the community to mindfulness and creativity using Chatfield as the teaching tool. I received a generous grant from the local energy cooperative and partnerships with the businesses in town. The idea is to explore a topic without resorting to 'remembering when'. To learn to experience an activity as if this is the first time you have experienced it. To pay attention to the right here, right now. This is, hopefully, going to help us all as we live with memory decline or care for those who have memory loss. Instead of valuing what we remember, we are learning to value what we experience in the moment. Each session includes an activity centered on creativity. Relearning how to delight in our creativity as adults is a great exercise in joy and hope.

And don't we all need more joy and hope in our lives? As I am surrounded by many, many nativity scenes in my house, some from my travels and some given to me as gifts, this is the message of the nativity story: that into our dark and messed up world God was willing to bring hope and joy. And each culture can interpret that story in a unique way that speaks light into their particular darkness.

So even in the midst of this dark and messed up world I refuse to give up on hope and joy, if God can gift it to us, knowing all the God knows, it would be silly for me to refuse that kind of gift. And I hope that this year will be the year that enough of us say, "I will believe in hope and joy. I will live as if hope and joy actually exist in this world. Whatever I do, I will do it so that others can experience hope and joy."

And then, I believe, we will begin to see even more of God's kindom come on earth.

January 5, 2020 - Choose Hope

Matthew 2:1–12 "They were overjoyed at seeing the star and, upon entering the house, found the child with Mary, his mother."

Something to think about, talk about, or do

January 12, 2020 – Loved--Baptism of Jesus

Matthew 3:13–17 "This is my Own, my Beloved, on whom my favor rests."

Something to think about, talk about, or doAs God's creation, we are beloved children, and God seeks to have a relationship with us. We see this in the story of Jesus' baptism when God claims Jesus as his son. January 19, 2020 - Called

Isaiah 49:1–7 "I will make you the light of the nations, so that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth." Something to think about, talk about, or do

Consider the lighthouse: it stands at the edge of the land ready to face any weather that may come its way. The one job a lighthouse has is to shine, guide, and protect. So it is with us, we are given by God as a "light to the nations" according to Isaiah. We are called, to let the light of God's love reach the ends of the Earth. Consider and share how we are a light to the world. Are we shining brightly? Are we too bright?

January 26, 2020 – Follow

Matthew 4:12–23 "Large crowds followed Jesus, coming from Galilee, the Decapolis, Jerusalem, Judea and the Transjordan."

Something to think about, talk about, or do

Simon Peter and Andrew gave up everything to follow Jesus, just because they were invited. They left their livelihood as fishers to follow where Jesus would lead. The story suggests that they didn't even question, rather "immediately they left their nets and followed him."
